CALL FOR NOMINATIONS 2019-2020

Nominations are still being accepted for 2019-2020 NJ Local Section of AIHA (NJAIHA) Executive Committee for President-elect and Director of Publications. NJAIHA needs interested members who want to continue the legacy of the organization in order to protect worker health. If you are interested in running for one of these leadership positions, please forward your name and a brief biography or resume to: info@njaiha.org.

The President-elect position is a **three (3) year** opportunity that begins with one-year sequential terms as President-elect, President, and Past President. Elected members of the NJAIHA Executive Committee whom are CIHs can receive 0.5 ABIH Continuing Maintenance (CM) points annually per year for their service. The President can receive 1 full point for that year.

The Director of Publications is also a three (3) year term that can also "earn" 0.5 CM points for each year served.

Elected officers must be members of National AIHA and remain in good standing with NJAIHA to be considered for the position. OSHA Requests Information on Possible Updates to the Lockout/Tagout Standard

OSHA is considering updates to its Lockout/Tagout Standard, and has a bevy of questions they are seeking answers to. You can find these questions and much more in OSHA's request for information (RFI) at https://bit.ly/30n5xFn. Please note that although it is not stated in the RFI, OSHA has indicated that comments must be submitted on or before August 18, 2019.

Updates on Notable and Key Bills

Arizona

- SB 1494: Requires the Department of Health Services (DHS) to adopt rules relating to nonprofit medical marijuana dispensary inspection and the certification of independent laboratories for testing. Requires DHS to develop a marijuana laboratory testing reference library and establishes the Medical Marijuana Advisory Council. Contains requirements for enactment for initiatives and referendums (Proposition 105 and Proposition 108).
 - AIHA Position: Not Established
 - Status: (5/28) Sent to the Governor

Illinois

- SB 1407: Creates the Illinois Hazardous Materials Workforce Training Act. Provides that the Department of Labor shall develop by rule a curriculum of approved advanced safety training for workers at high hazard facilities. Provides that an owner or operator, when contracting for the performance of construction work at the stationary source, shall require that its contractors and any subcontractors use a skilled and trained workforce to perform all onsite work within an apprenticeable occupation in the building and construction trades. Provides a penalty for violation of the Act. Creates the Illinois Hazardous Materials Workforce Training Fund as a special fund in the State treasury.
 - AIHA Position: Not Established
 - Status: (5/27) Placed on Calendar Order of 3rd Reading Short Debate

Michigan

- HB 4282: Would allow students to fulfill the health education requirements for receiving a high school diploma by completing a 30-hour training course designed by OSHA for construction or general industry.
 - AIHA Position: Support
 - Status: Ways and Means Committee <u>hearing</u> held on 5/23/19

Nevada

- AB 290: Would require certain persons who successfully complete a course in construction industry safety and health hazard recognition to submit certain evidence thereof to the Division of Industrial Relations of the Department of Business and Industry; requiring the Division to establish registries to track trainers who provide courses in construction industry safety and health hazard recognition and persons who successfully complete such courses; revising provisions governing the duties of a trainer who provides courses in construction industry safety and health hazard recognition; revising provisions requiring certain employees on certain sites related to the entertainment industry to receive certain health and safety training; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.
 - AIHA Position: Support
 - Status: (5/29) Approved by the Governor
- AB 348: An Act relating to occupational safety and health; requiring a medical facility to develop and carry out a plan for the prevention of workplace violence and report incidents of workplace violence to the Division of Industrial Relations of the Department of Business and Industry; prohibiting a medical facility from taking certain actions against an employee who seeks the assistance of a public safety agency in response to workplace violence or who reports workplace violence; requiring a medical facility to maintain certain records and provide copies of those records to certain persons upon request; requiring the Division to publish an annual report concerning workplace violence at medical facilities; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.
 - AIHA Position: Support
 - Status: Hearing held by the Senate Finance Committee on 5/29/19

New Jersey

- AB 10: Revises requirements to authorize and access medical cannabis; establishes requirements for institutional caregivers; revises permit requirements for alternative treatment centers; and establishes additional legal protections for patients and caregivers. Includes requirements for workplace health and safety.
 - AIHA Position: Not Established
 - Status: Passed the Senate (33-4)
